She is a student at the Dance Arts Center in Southfield, and joined the Detroit City Ballet last year as an apprentice. And though she will still be appearing in the Apprentice Company Workshop, she will also join the major company in one of their dances.

The Farmington Junior High School student has been serving as understudy for the major company, and as such, she must be able to dance any role of the major company dancers. She has been called on to do this several times.

**SHE IS AN** all A eighth grader, and when not dancing, she enjoys reading and playing the flute. As a musician she recently earned a No. 1 rating in the District Solo and Ensemble Festival.

Her ballet company is a charter member of the Northeast Regional Ballet Festival Association, now in its 17th season.

The company's purpose is to encourage and assist talented young dancers, and to provide opportunity for them to prepare for professional careers.

The company's artistic director is Marjorie Hassard.

**THE COMPANY** has received a grant from the Michigan Council of the Arts this year and was also selected to appear at the Music Hall in May as part of Detroit's Bicentennial Celebration.

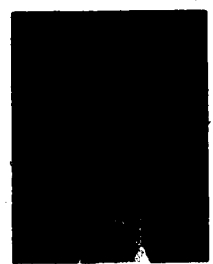
