

# 2 records shattered in Lathrup track win

Bob Goldschmidt and Bill Breslin shattered school records to help Southfield-Lathrup defeat Bloomfield Hills Lathrup, 10-5, in a Metro Suburban Association track meet last Thursday.

Goldschmidt broke his old record in the 120-yard high hurdles with a 15.5 clocking. He also won the 100 low hurdles in :30.9, and then ran a leg on Lathrup's winning 400 relay. Breslin broke the old high jump mark with a 6'11 1/2 performance.

"You have to be happy when you win 14 of 15 events," said Lathrup coach Gerald Mierwasser, whose team is 1-4. "There were personal bests all over the place. Mitch Joseph got 59 feet, 4 1/4 inches. Larry Harris Rader set a school record in the pole vault by winning at 11-4. Jeff Thomas, a Hawk sophomore with bright prospects, broke his arm after he took a spill in the high hurdles. He broke the same arm while running the same event last year at East Junior High.

Livonia Franklin beat North Farmington, 67-56, in a Northwest Suburban League meet last Thursday.

Franklin had sweeps in the mile run and the 100-yard dash to put it out of reach. Some North Farmington firsts: Bob Patek (19-7 in the long jump), Dave Marchiori (11-0 in the pole vault), and Tom Moore (40-4 in the shot put).

Marchiori, a senior, was in better form April 11 when North Farmington edged Waterford Mont. 63-61.

## Farmington wins, 10-5

# Errors kill Raiders

North Farmington's baseball team scored eight runs but committed five errors to allow Livonia Franklin a 12-8 win in the Raiders' Northwest Suburban League opener last Wednesday.

Coach Tom Wallis' team beat non-league Novi, 6-5, in the first game of the season, but committed 11 errors in their next two games and lost them both.

Nonleague Northville beat the Raiders, 6-5, April 11 followed by last Wednesday's fiasco and Wallis is getting worried about his team's shaky defense.

"The errors are killing us," he said. "There's not enough hitting and too many errors."

The Franklin game was a sloppy affair with a total of nine errors committed by the two teams. Senior Todd Byrne and junior John Patek had two hits each and they accounted for the Raiders' three runs batted in. North Farmington had six hits.

Franklin's big blow came in the fifth inning when Daryl Gantner hit a bases loaded triple. Other than that, the Raiders' pitching hasn't really been a problem. John Jajich, who pitched against Franklin, Bob Fleischacker, and Mike Lowery, have performed satisfactorily, according to Wallis.

"They haven't given up that many hits," he said. "But I may have to try some different combinations to get something to work for us defensively."

Harrison-W.L. Western

Farmington Harrison was shutout for the second straight game last Wednesday against Walled Lake Western, but Hawk coach Jon Herrington isn't worried yet about his team's apparent lack of offensive punch. "We've been hitting the ball but they just haven't been falling in for us," he said. "At least we've been making contact with the ball."

As a matter of fact, Harrison had two more hits than Western did but failed to capitalize. With one out in the seventh inning, the Hawks loaded the bases but two batters struck out to kill Harrison's only serious threat.

Western scored its only two runs on two hits and a sacrifice fly and Novi beat Harrison by the same 2-0 score in the opening game of the season.

I think we'll be all right," Herrington said. "Our pitching and defense have been fine. Steve Morrison is a tremendous hitter but he's had two long shots caught and Sam Pink is in a slump but once our field dries up we can get outside for more hitting practice."

Thomas homered, Randy Meier and Dick Radatz walked, advanced on a passed ball, and both scored when Jim Brown was safe on an error. Ron Patrick and Paul Line followed with singles to boost Farmington's lead to 7-5.


