

Seaholm stops Jay netters

Kensington course is open for play

The golf course at Kensington Metropark near Milford is open. The 18-hole course covers 6,300 yards and par is 71 strokes.

Weather and morning frost conditions permitting, hours are 8 a.m. to dusk daily. Earlier starting times are in force on weekends and holidays, and the hours will be extended later in the season.

Fees for the course are \$4.50 for 18 holes Monday through Friday, \$5.50 for 18 holes weekends and holidays, \$3.00 for nine holes on weekdays, \$2.50 for nine holes on weekends and holidays.

Golfers must provide their own equipment. Power carts, hand carts and a limited line of accessories are available at the Golf Starter Building. Power cart rates are \$8.30 for 18 holes, and \$5.30 for nine holes. Hand carts may be rented for 50 cents.

The Huron-Clinton Metropark 1975 vehicle entry permits are required to enter the park from May through September. Kensington is located at I-96 and Kent Lake Road.
