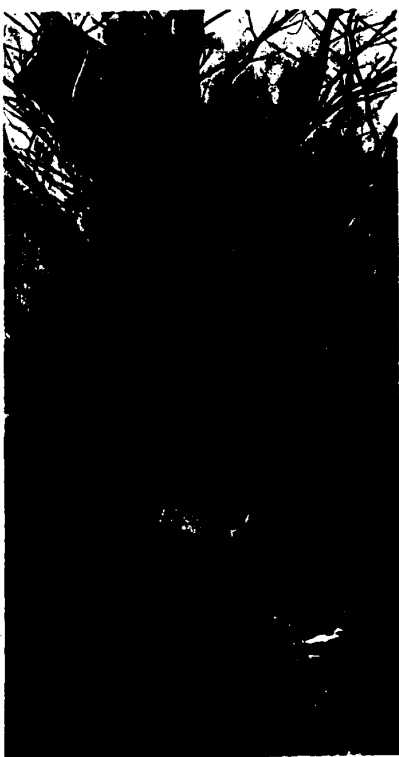

Dr. Peter Orlando, psychologist, will speak each Thursday. He will be assisted by professional leaders in conducting group discussions following the lecture.

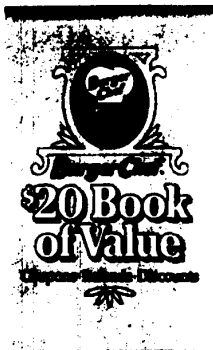
