

Volunteers to operate hospital coffee shop

The Sinal Hospital Women's Guild is preparing to open its new Coffee Shop in the hospital's main, Outer Drive lobby.

Mrs. David Dunsky of Southfield, president of the 3,000 member organization said the profits will go to the hospital.

According to Mrs. Dunsky, the new 52 seat coffee-shop-Cafeteria will be opening within the next month.

It will serve the public and hospital personnel from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily, except Saturdays.

"It's a new area for us," said Mrs. Dunsky.

"We have loads of experience in all phases of retailing from our Gift Shop operations at Sinal. But now we're hunting for women who will enjoy restaurant work."

The coffee shop will serve cafeteria-style, with a menu featuring delicatessen sandwiches, home-made soups, salads and pastries.

"We think it will be a pleasant departure from the normal atmosphere of institutional dining," said Mrs. Dunsky, "and a great convenience to visitors."

Adjacent to the coffee shop will be a new, enlarged gift shop which is also rapidly nearing completion.

The gift shop is operated entirely by volunteers and over its more than 20 years of operation has contributed all of its profits to the hospital's Department of Research.

"When you realize how much we

have been able to contribute to medical research, and it comes to hundreds of thousands of dollars, then you can see that a successful coffee shop operation will be an important factor," she said.

"But to insure success, we need more volunteers."

Coffee shop hours for volunteers will be split into two short shifts, 8 a.m. to noon or noon to 4 p.m., she said.
