influences them is a simple, basic defense of the self. It is because of a fear of being hurt, a vague anxiety, that it is necessary to acquire an art in communication and listening."

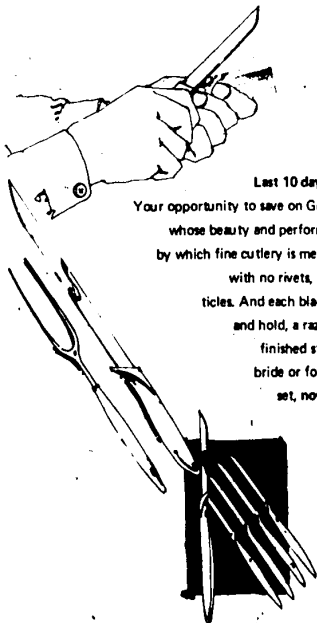

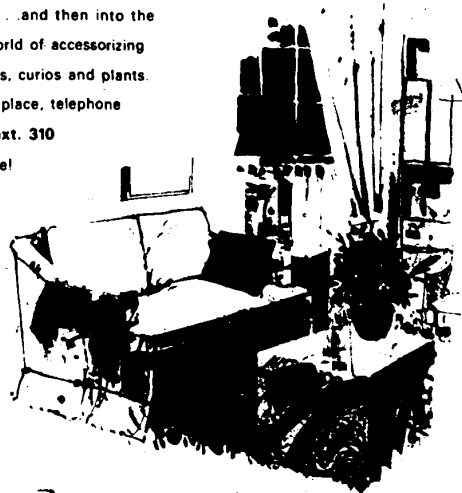
