Focus: HOPE is topic at women's luncheon

Father William T. Cunningham, co-founder of Detroit's Focus: HOPE, a food prescription program that currently supplements the diets of 35,000 mothers and children, will be the guest speaker at the April 29 luncheon of the Women's Association of the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington.

Focus: HOPE was organized in 1968 as a response to the fears that grew out of the 1967 riots which devastated Detroit. It attempted to bring together the widest possible range of people who believed in brotherhood in its efforts to eradicate the crippling effects of racial discrimination.

Originally designed to serve 3,500 people, the food prescription program quota now reaches 35,000.

FR. CUNNINGHAM criticizes what he calls the paranoid opposition to getting food to mothers and babies.

"A lack of protein in babies' diets conditions the development of their brain power, and no matter what you do with Headstart, no matter what you do with a better school system, you're not going to help this kid if his diet has been bad. He should have been born with a 120 IQ; he's got a 105. Or he's got an 80 as the result of real starvation."

"So we pushed into that, and the way we did it was with volunteers. Volunteers pick up the mothers and kids who couldn't get to the food, and we make the existing program work."

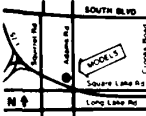

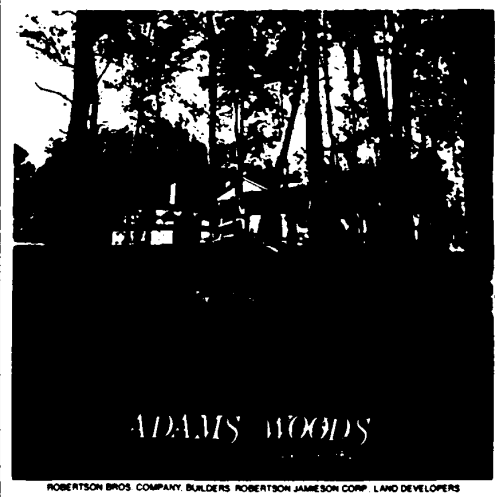

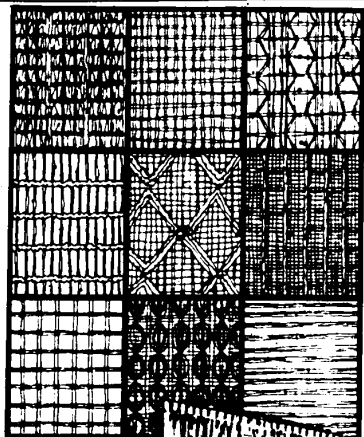
