## Soften corners

If you live in a tract house you're probably wondering why those corners seem so square in every room. They're easier to build, that's why.

It is portable, inexpensive, easy to store when you get tired of looking at it, easy to make and definitely an asset in a decorating scheme.

Screens can be as wide and

tall as you need them (from three to six panels) and as colorful or decorative as you will. They can be a place to display small, flat artworks, they can add texture and pattern or they'll add a small alcove to a larger room.

Screens run the gamut from the elegant — and costly — Carmandel inlaid ones from the Orient — to old doors hinged together and covered with burlap. Any way you screen it, you create a new area or help define an old one.
