Gambling arrests are made at DRC

Eight persons from Detroit suburbs lost their gamble with Livonia Police and face court appearances for holding an illegal bookmaking operation on the Detroit Race Course grounds. A June 12 arraignment is scheduled in Livonia District Court following their release. The eight were charged with conspiracy to violate the state gambling laws. The defendants are: Laurence Lesbman, 41, of 10199 Willowick, Southfield; Lawrence Schwartz, 42, of 23670 Carriage Hill, Southfield; Marvin Cohen, 28, of Southfield; Theodore Sakataelos, 24, of 37704 Yuma, Westland; Arthur Iaconelli, 51, of 5889 Lockland, Dearborn Heights; Michael Teem, 29, of 6811 Kirkwood, Detroit; William Montroy, 28, of 1728 Gaylord, Redford Township; and Patrick McCue, 28, of 15801 Code, Southfield. The eight were arrested by Livonia policemen and officers from the Thoroughbred Racing Protection Bureau, which oversees race track security.

Farmington will protest utility rates

FARMINGTON—Two state utilities will receive letters from the city council protesting requests for a raise in service rates. The city council voted Monday to send the letters to the Michigan Public Service Commission to protest rate increase requests filed by Michigan Bell Telephone and Detroit Edison. City manager Robert Dredman said he received a letter from the commission stating that the request filed by Bell Telephone would raise that company's revenues by \$88 million annually. Farmington customers would pay \$7.20 a month for one party flat rate, up from \$6.55. Local suburban business customers would see an increase from \$7.35 per line per month to \$8.20 per line per month. Move and change charges would be increased from the current \$11.75 to \$12.80 for both residential and business customers. Detroit Edison's rate increase request will enlarge that company's revenues by \$172 million annually. The company is also petitioning the commission for an immediate interim increase of \$88.1 million. Depending on user classification, the rate increase would raise current user's costs 18 - 20 per cent.
