FARMINGTON—Two state utilities will receive letters from the city council protosting requests for a raise is service rates.

The city council voted Monday to send the letters to the Michigan Public Service Commission to protest rate increase requests filed by Michigan Bell Telephone and Detroit Edison. City manager Robert Deadman said he received a letter from the commission stating that the request filed by Bell Telephone would raise that company's revenues by 888 million annually.
