

Dan Delling, a graduate of North Farmington High School, played a big part in Ferris State College's baseball success this spring. And Ferris' accomplishments were many.

Ferris' baseballers set three Bulldog records and tied a fourth en route to their second-straight Great Lakes Conference championship. Delling, a senior first baseman, led the Bulldogs in just about every offensive category.

He finished with a .361 career batting average — Ferris' second highest ever. His 94 hits in 260 at bats was topped only by the .433 average of former Chicago Cub Carmen Fanzone, who played at Ferris in 1960-61.

This season Delling led Ferris hitters with a .376 average. He knocked in 22 runs and pounded out 47 hits in 125 at bats, including eight doubles, three triples and four home runs.

Those eight doubles tied a Ferris one-season record. Delling's .584 slugging average and 23 stolen bases were also school highs.

For his accomplishments, Delling was named to the all-NAIA District 21

and the all-Great Lakes Conference teams. Bulldog pitcher Greg Schrumpt of Niles joined Desling on both teams. Schrumpt set a school record with his 1.13 earned run average.

Other Ferris standouts: Pat Trierweiler, a sophomore shortstop from Portland, Mich. who trailed Deling with a .346 average and 21 RBIs; Mark Newcom, a freshman from Center Line St. Clement, had a 4-0 pitch-

Southfield's league dual-meet record (8-2) lifted it into a second-place tie with Kimball in the final overall standings.

Southfield players reached the finals in No. 3 and No. 4 singles. Seasholtz's Scott Wilkinson beat David Lee, 7-6, 6-4, in No. 3, and Seasholtz's Wyndham Gary stopped sophomore Todd Ballard, 6-2, 6-4, in No. 4.

In No. 1 doubles, Kimball's Mark Olson and Mike Cornell defeated

Southfield's Elliot Rossen and Bob Gendelman, 6-4, 1-6, 6-4. Southfield's No. 2 doubles team of Howard Tischler and Sheldon Kretzman also made the finals. They lost to Seaholm's Dave Wood and Jeff Parsigian, 6-3, 3-6, 6-2.

Rossen and Gendelman beat Seaholm's Jeff Muhn and Sandy Dickinson, 6-3, 1-6, 6-3, in a tough match to reach the finals.

"That was a good match," said Southfield coach Jim Mills. "They (Rosen and Gendelman) were just a little off against Olson and Cornell in the finals. They'd already beaten them (the Kimball team) about a week ago. This time, they won the second set, but they couldn't put it together in the third. They just couldn't wrap it up."

Lathrup pole vaulter Larry Harris set a school record with a 13-3/4 effort against Southfield. Gould joined Bob Goldschmid, Andy Theodorou and Brian Bollin on the 880-yard relay which won in 1:35.2.

Lathrup's Mitch Joseph won the shot put with a 52-8½ toss, and teammate Jim Yee took the long jump with a 29-10½ leap.

Southfield High, winless in dual meets this season, had a double winner against Lathrup. Steve Trowbridge won the 120 high hurdles in :15.2 and the 180 low hurdles in :20.0. Blue Jay Mike Bryan won the mile run in 4:45.6.
