



BRONZE PLAQUE WINNER PATER NIELSEN

OCC forensic team winds up winning year

The Forensic Team of Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge Campus, under the direction of Joan Leinsinger competed in numerous tournaments during the 1974-75 year winning 16 trophies, three of which were Meet Sweepstakes prizes awarded to the team scoring the most points.

In addition to the 16 team trophies, Mrs. Leinsinger, a long time Royal Oak resident, won an award for superior judging at the Phi Rho Pi Regional Tournament held at Lorain Community College in Ohio.

Members of the team include Karen Buccille of Southfield, Jean Clanton of Detroit, Christine Duncley of Walled Lake, Joseph Duncley of Ferndale, Gayle Kaurala of Farmington Hills, Kathy Kidd of New Hudson, Zelma Lang of Southfield, Stewart Leach of Detroit, and Pater Nielsen of Farmington Hills.

Nine colleges and universities were represented at the final Michigan Intercollegiate Speech League Meet held at Wayne State University this spring. Nielsen and Miss Duncley

represented the Orchard Ridge Campus with Ms. Duncley placing fourth.

THE CULMINATION of the successful year, however, came in Sacramento, when Nielsen represented the team at the National Phi Rho Pi Speech Tournament. Competing against 136 college speakers, Nielsen won a bronze plaque for Persuasive Speaking. He was also awarded six Certificates of Excellence for Persuasive Speaking, plus three for Excellence in Oral Interpretation Competition.

In addition, Nielsen was honored by his election as National Executive-Student Secretary of Phi Rho Pi, the National Honorary Forensic Society. He was also elected vice president of Phi Rho Pi, Region 8, which includes Michigan, Ohio, and Pennsylvania.

"We are all very proud of Pater and his work this year on behalf of forensics at Orchard Ridge," Mrs. Leinsinger noted. "We are looking forward to another successful year with Pater

and numerous other students participating in the forensic activities."

Golf lessons also are offered at a cost of \$12 for a four-week session.

Besides FARC programs, the booklet mailed to about 20,000 residences lists activities for other area groups. Classes offered by the Farmington YMCA and Farmington Community Center are listed.

"THE BROCHURE is going to tell them what's going on in the way of recreation in the community," Gaynor said.

John Richardson, chairman of the FARC, said he is "very encouraged" by the summer program. For the first time, Richardson said, FARC has "expanded to a year round program."

The FARC's tentative budget is about \$14,000, awaiting ratification of city budgets. The cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills contribute on a 20 per cent—80 per cent split. The Farmington School District contributes the use of its buildings and grounds.

The budget is up from \$14,000, the figure for "years and years and years." Last year it was \$95,000, Gaynor said.
