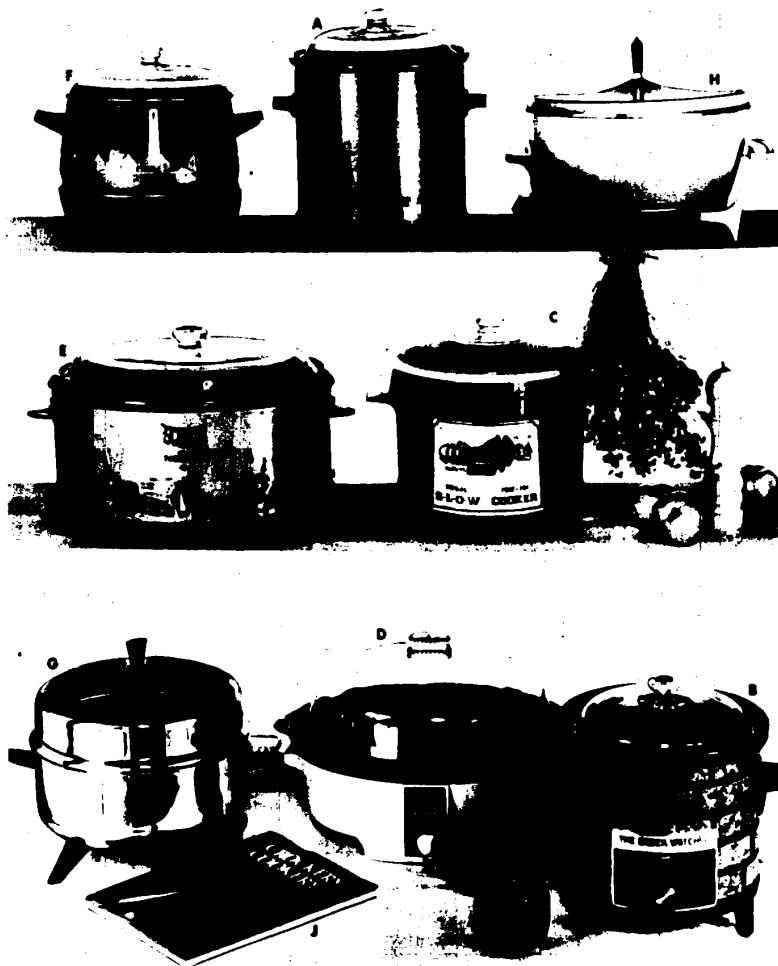
### Farmington woman gets business degree
