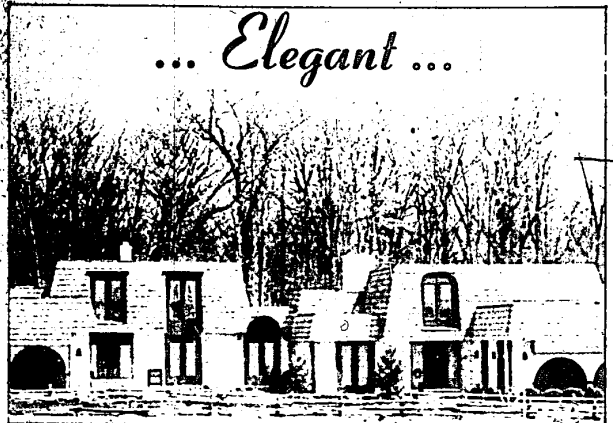

Warfield to sing in Haydn oratorio

William Warfield, one of the great vocal artists of our time will appear at the Music Hall in Detroit, Sunday at 8 p.m. as bass soloist in Joseph Haydn's oratorio "The Creation." Warfield will be performing with the Detroit Schola Cantorum and orchestra under the direction of Steven Glenn.
Warfield has performed with most of the major orchestras in the world including the Cleveland and Philadelphia orchestras, the New York Philharmonic, the Boston and Chicago symphonies.
In addition, he has had performances with the Berlin, Athens, and Geneva Orchestras as well as an annual engagement since 1965 with the Vienna Volksoper.
An actor, Warfield has also appeared on Broadway in "Call Me Mister", "Set My People Free", "Regina" and "The Little Foxes", as well as playing De Lawd in "The Green Pastures" on NBC-TV for Hallmark Hall of Fame.
Additional soloists include Harold Orbach of Bloomfield Township, Cantor at Temple Israel, Tenor and Sally Wylie of Birmingham, who recently played Adele in the Michigan Opera Theatre's production of "Die Fledermaus", Soprano.

Class C — Teenager, age 17 and under, black and white only. Maximum 8" by 10" print on 11" by 14" mount.
Class 1 — Color Prints, all makes, any size print up to 16" by 20", must be on 16" by 20" mount.
Non-theme photographs will be accepted in two classes:
Class 2 — Black and white. Maximum 16" by 20" print on 16" by 20" mount.
Class 3 — Color prints. Maximum 16" by 20" print on 16" by 20" mount.
Trophies, cash awards, and ribbons of merit will be awarded in all classes. In addition to class awards, Focus America prints will be eligible for Best of Show recognition.

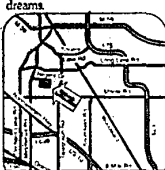
