FARMINGTON HILLS—The Farmington Hills planning commission will hold preliminary public hearings at 8 p.m. July 10 on three site plan approval requests and two rezoning.

Site plan requests are for apartments at 31543 Nine Mile, senior citizens housing at Detroit Baptist Manor, 30251 Thirteen Mile, and convalescent home, St. Clare of Assisi Parish, 22200 Ten Mile.

Rezoning requests are for the Farmington Freeway Industrial Park, from light industrial to commercial, and the south side of Fourteen Mile between Club House and Glenmar, from one family residential to multiple residential.
