

Park concert features Sousa music July 17

The University of Michigan-Flint Summer Symphonic Band comes to Summer in the Park on Thursday, July 17, with a program of all-American music.

The format is that of a typical concert in the park around the turn of the century and one of the most outstanding bands of that era, led by John Philip Sousa.

This is the first year of the summer band, consisting of about 100 instrumental musicians from the greater Flint area. Members come from 21 different high schools, colleges and universities, and about 10 percent of the members are receiving credit for their membership.

The band is sponsored by the University of Michigan-Flint, the music department, the public affairs committee and U-M Extension Service.

It is conducted by Dr. A. Raymond

Roth, chairman of the U-M-Flint music department, William Himes and Barry Wentz, both part-time instructors at the university, act as assistant conductors.

In addition to Sousa, the band will play selections written by Gomez, Beisterling, Gluck, Charpentier, Chambers, Herbert, Hewitt, Clarke, and Fillmore.

Show time is 8 p.m. in Shawwassee Park.

Featured courses include pottery, jewelry, drawing and painting with a newly-instituted experimental program in off-loom fibers for teens, being taught by Jan Rosen-Querratt, an area fiber specialist who apprenticed with the international weaving celebrity, Senior Grau Garriga of Barcelona, Spain. Classes end Aug. 14.
