## Rodeo returns for 3rd festival

The World Championship Rodeo is back for the third year to bring contestants from all over the country to the Founders Festival.

The Farmington Area Jaycees and its auxiliary will co-sponsor three shows on Friday and Saturday, July 25-26, on the southwest corner of Twelve Mile and Farmington roads. Show time is 8 p.m. on Friday and 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. Saturday.
