The pre-emptive opening bid is aggressive. With only six cards in the suit, the action is not normal but does reflect the vulnerability.

East put more pressure on the opposition by raising. North could have doubled, but South naturally found a four-suit call.

West led the king of clubs. East's double is a two-way action. It is easy to judge that the opponents are too high, but the double of a voluntary slam suggests an unusual lead.

The double usually asks for a lead of dummy's suit, but in this case since dummy has not bid a suit, the inference must be that defender is prepared for a lead in either minor suit.

West led the club king and the defense was easy. East signaled with the nine.

Notice the double causes the contract to be defeated by two tricks. Any other opening lead allows the slam to be successful. Luckily, South could discard two clubs one on the heart and the other on the diamond 10 after ruffing the third round of the suit.

## Father Wright named pastor in Hills parish

Rev. James B. Wright has been appointed pastor of St. Alexander Catholic Church in Farmington Hills. He is the successor of Rev. Albert C. Koeh who died in April, and Rev. Joseph Ryder, the founding pastor.

"We've got to build a real family spirit here at St. Alexander's where the caring extends out to all people in the community," he said. "If the church is to survive in this world, it must be demonstrated through the everyday day-in-and-day-out lives of its people."

St. Alexander has been noted for its family-oriented philosophy since its founding. Within the past year a Christian Service Committee was initiated which has since involved more than 200 of the parishioners. Sub-committees' services extend from family counseling to growing fresh vegetables for those who need them.

The parish centers itself around its religious education program which offers classes to those of all ages of this. Fr. Wright says, "Worship is meaningless without education, and Christian Service is the outgrowth of genuine worship. It is my hope to build a community where the life of Jesus is evidenced in our own lives."

Fr. Wright was ordained to the priesthood in the Archdiocese of Detroit in 1969. Since ordination, he has served at St. Mel Parish until 1973, and then joined St. Alexander in March 1973 as associate pastor.


