Student earns Harvard grant

Joan Weiner, 20, of Farmington Hills, will continue an already distinguished educational career on a full graduate fellowship at Harvard University this fall.

While a student at Farmington Harrison High School, Miss Weiner was a National Merit scholar. She entered the University of Michigan at the end of her junior year, was a Branstrom scholar at the university and received the Herbert Boynton prize for outstanding scholarship and research.

At Harvard Miss Weiner will be working on a doctorate in symbolic philosophy, an area that combines mathematics, logic and philosophy.

Her degree from the University of Michigan is in math.

The Harvard grant is for two years after which she hopes to teach there for several years more, working toward the goal of becoming a college professor.

As a math major at the university, she decided to investigate philosophy and began taking courses in logic. It was through these courses that she developed her interest in the unusual and challenging aspects of the combination of the three disciplines.

She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Sheldon Weiner of Farmington Hills. Mr. and Mrs. Weiner plan to move to Washington D.C. next year.

Safe camping makes enjoyable camping

The Interior Department has a publication to help you enjoy your camping trip fully and safely. For a copy of "Camping in the National Park System," send 65 cents to Consumer Information, Dept. 31, Pueblo, Colorado 81009.

The booklet includes a chart of national parks and the activities they offer. The listing includes length of the camping season, campground type and fee, as well as availability of swimming, fishing, and boating.

IT ALSO includes the following safety advice:

- Know the area — consult park brochures and maps, and ask about park attractions and hazards.
- Keep your distance from wild animals — don't feed bears or other wildlife. The most common injury to park visitors from wild animals is a bite from a chipmunk, squirrel, or other rodent that is being fed at the roadside or campsite. A bite from a rabid chipmunk can be as dangerous as one from a rabid dog.
- Dress sensibly — even in the heat of summer, it is often cool in the mountains or caves. If you're hiking on rough terrain, be sure to wear sturdy shoes or boots.
- Notify park headquarters of your plans to explore: mountain climbing, hiking or horseback riding in remote areas; exploring caves or lake bottoms; and similar plans can be dangerous even for experts. If they know your plans, park rangers can alert you to hazards, watch for your return, and if need be, organize rescue efforts. Telling them your plans could save your life.
- Don't try it alone — two heads are safer than one. Whether it's a short hike in the woods or a month-long mountain climb, a companion may save your life in an emergency.
- Know your own limits — strenuous exertion in extremes of temperature or altitude can be dangerous if you are unaccustomed to sustained exercise.

"Camping in the National Park System" is among the many Federal consumer publications made available through the Consumer Information Center of the General Services Administration. The Center publishes the quarterly Consumer Information Index, which lists almost 250 selected federal consumer publications. A free copy of the Index is available from Consumer Information, Pueblo, Colorado 81009, or at Federal Information Centers located throughout the country.

Police try trick shooting

A gigantic fire department water fight will cap this display when firefighters fight firefighters with water at 1 p.m. on Saturday, July 26, in the Kendallwood Shopping Center.


