

Land purchased for parking lot

In an attempt to provide more parking space for city hall, the City of Farmington, in conjunction with the Farmington Community Library, will purchase a lot 50 feet wide by 264 feet in length.

The purchase is necessary, according to City Manager Robert Deadman, because of expansion of city hall facilities and an addition to the branch library in downtown Farmington. The property would provide an estimated 25 extra parking spaces, says Deadman.

Both the library and city hall will share use of the lot.

The city will pay \$30,000 to the present owner, Mrs. Emma Cole, 33509 State Street. The purchase is based on a seven year land contract, with \$8,500 down, at a rate of 7.5 per cent interest. Mrs. Cole will have 90 days free rent from the date of closing and shall pay the city \$10.99 a day for each day after the 90 day period expires, if she remains on the property.

"It may be necessary for the city to advance the Farmington Community Library its share of the down payment and carry that amount in accounts receivable until July 1, 1976," said Deadman.

The current construction of the new Farmington branch has caused some concern over their cash position. After the construction is completed, the board will evaluate their resources and make a determination regarding when repayment can be made.


