Hamilton Corp. reports increase

Income improvement for the first six-months and second quarter of 1975 was reported recently by Richard H. Headlee, president and chief executive officer of Hamilton International Corp. and its principal subsidiary, Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance Co. of America.

Hamilton International is based in Farmington.

Net income for the six-month period ended June 30 totaled \$1,850,000 or 24 cents per share, compared with income of \$1,675,500 or 21 cents per share for the same period last year.

Revenues for the six months amounted to \$17 million, compared with \$18 million reported for the same time in 1974.

"The reduction in revenues was due to our decision to withdraw from certain group life, health and accident insurance cases which were unprofitable," Headlee said.

"WE HAVE directed our efforts toward individual ordinary life insurance, and due to the concentrated effort in this area, our first year earned premium income increased 63 percent for the first six months of this year."

For the three-month, second quarter period ended June 30, the company's net income was \$1,132,200, or 15 cents per share on revenues of \$9,207,800. Results for the same period last year were \$10,228,800 in revenues and net income of \$1,007,500, or 13 cents per share.

Headlee said that the results registered by the company for the period marked the 10th consecutive quarter in which income, before realized investment gains, exceeded the quarterly performance for the previous year.

"This has been an outstanding example of a corporate turnaround and we are pleased with the company's performance and excited about the future," he said.

Accounting methods for both 1975 and 1974 conform to generally accepted accounting principles set forth by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants audit guide for stock life insurance companies.
