Adat Shalom invites new members to picnic

There will be supervised activity planned for the children, both inside and out of the building.

"A good portion of our congregation will be there to welcome newcomers and, of course, we will want them to meet our rabbi and president of the congregation," said Anne Benderhoff, spokeswoman for the planning committee.

Also on hand to greet guests will be a representative from each of the congregation's affiliate associations.

WE HAVE SEVERAL youth programs, an adult education program, an extremely active Men's Club and Sisterhood," Mrs. Benderhoff said. "We'll have somebody there to answer questions concerning all of them."

Adat Shalom is a conservative synagogue affiliated with United Synagogue of America. Its purpose is to fulfill the religious, educational and cultural needs of the Jewish community. Membership now stands at almost 900 families.

Religious leaders of the congregation are Rabbi Jacob Segal and Rabbi Seymour Rosenbloom. President of the congregation is Gerald Rosenbloom.

There are two entrances to the synagogue. One is on Middle Belt Road, south of Northwestern Highway. The other is on Thirteenth Mile Road, west of Middle Belt.

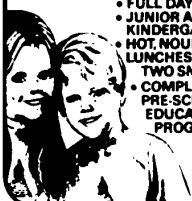
