If you suspect that your pet has been poisoned, act rapidly. Call your veterinarian at once. Since some poisons enter the blood-stream almost immediately, any delay in getting medical aid for your pet could prove fatal.

Pet injuries resulting from burns are also fairly common around the home. Whatever the degree of the burn, it is very painful. Cats, for example, are so fond of warm spots that they may jump on a hot surface and scoret their footpads. A pet can be burned by hot liquids applied from the table or stove, by nosing into an electric current or by some chemical or corrosive substance.

In addition, pets can be poisoned by toxic plants such as dieffenbachia, philodendron, large-leaf ivies and mushrooms. Common sources of lead poisoning around the home include paint, putty, plaster, lubricants, linoleum and toys.

The signs of poisoning are as varied as the sources of poisoning are and the severity of the reaction usually depends on the amount of poison eaten. In some cases, the symptoms may appear suddenly and dramatically. IF YOUR PET suffers a serious IF YOUR PET sutters a serious burn or scald, cover the area lightly with a clean, dry dressing such as sterile gauze, a handker-chief, sheet or towel. Keep your pet warm, dry and quiet, as he-may be in a state of shock. Then rush him to your veterinarian.
