It will be like old times when the league bowling season opens with this

promise of three or four teams being in the battle for the championship. In recent years the Stroh combination, paced by Mike Tokely, has dominated the scene. Long before a single ball was rolled, Stroh was considered the team to beat.

Things give promise of being different this year and at least three teams—Dale Gervy's K&B squad, and the Goebel line-up out together by Tom Mc Kay, executive secretary of the Greater Detroit Bowling Association—are expected to fight it out all the way.

In what we now refer to as the "old days", back in the 30s and 40s, there were several teams in the thick of it with Stroh and even personal rivalries held much of the attention. This was especially true in the case of Joe Morris, the Stroh captain, and Johny Crimmins, the anchor man on Bob Thyme's Paris Cleaners team. Others among the top challengers included the Fife Electric team, captained by Louis Burr. Prior to bowling for Fife this combination won the state title under the banner of Deluxe Tool and Die.

In this group, too, was Ellis Walker's Wilson Dairy team and the Pepsi

Coke club captained by Cass Schaff. Later, there was Lou Skeloff and the Pfeiffer and the E&B teams.

Over the years, Stroh has evaluated its rivals until this season and there promises to be some interesting nights before the titles are decided.

It is much the same in the women's leagues. In the "old days" the Olympic team, captained by Clara Allen, dominated the Detroit scene. Three members of the team are enshrined in the Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame. They are Clara, Stella Hartwick and the late Lucille Stuchale.

During the Olympics' reign, the chief challengers were the late "Eddie" Gray's Colonial Broach team and Agnes Ekstrom's Gears by Enterprise, which went on to win national acclaim.

Mrs. Ekstrom, considered one of the best spare bowlers in the country, is now president of the Detroit Woman's Bowling Association and an honoree in the Hall of Fame. In recent years, Anita Cantaline's Jac-Ro team, with Elvira Toepfer, set the pace for the women. Then along came the Motown Record combination, Detroit Bowling Sales with Ann Selick, and Dolly Auch's "Pinky's" team to battle for honors. And it will be these same four teams favored to fight it out again for the title.


