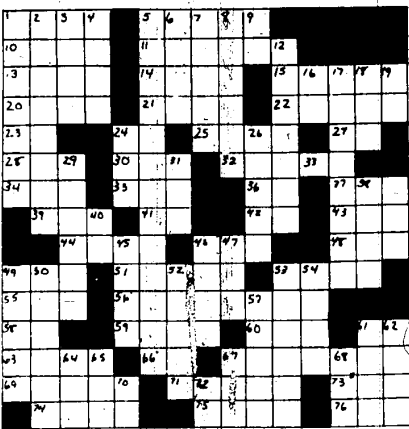

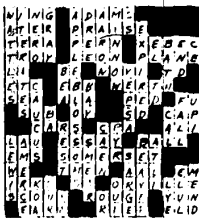

Of three cider mills in Oakland County, one is already open and the other two will be pressing apples beginning this weekend.

The Franklin Cider Mill, 7430 Franklin Road, Bloomfield Township, opened Labor Day. Hours are 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. seven days a week through Dec. 7, open until 8 p.m. Sundays in September and October.

The Paint Creek Cider Mill, 4483 Orion Road, Rochester, opens for the season Saturday. Hours are 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, through Nov. 16.
