

## Bowman elected youth chairman

George Bowman joined the Farmington Youth Assistance in March and was elected to its chairmanship the next month.

A Farmington resident, Bowman has been a school administrator for 30 years. He is a professor of education at Central Michigan University (CMU), in charge of student teaching programs for CMU students in Farmington, West Bloomfield, Clarenceville, Southfield, Birmingham, Redford-Upton, and Hazel Park.

Previously, he was president of Glen Oaks Community College near Sturgis and Three Rivers and recently ran unsuccessfully for a seat on the Farmington Board of Education. Bowman said the first priority of the referral program would be to enlarge their general citizen's committee from 18 to 15 people. This committee operates much like a board of directors, setting policy and overseeing the actions of various subcommittees.

The additional members would be ideally people who work closely with the police departments and city councils of Farmington and Farmington Hills.

"We feel a void there," he said.

THE YOUTH ASSISTANCE program was established more than four years ago by decree of an Oakland County Probate judge who ruled that every Oakland County school system should provide such a facility for its students.

"When a kid comes into court, that's bad," Bowman said. "Our whole purpose is to keep them out of the courts."

Members see the program as a buffer between minor offenders and the county court system. Used as a referral service by the police and the schools, Youth Assistance offers several programs for apprehended youths and their parents.

Social worker John Pinkerton counsels both parents and children. Dr. Peter Orlando, an area psychiatrist, worked with the group and developed a series of lectures and discussions for parents who wanted more insight into their child's misbehavior.

## OCC offers film course

The Oakland Community College Orchard Ridge Campus theater department will offer an "Introduction to Film" course during the fall semester.

Two sections of the course have been scheduled. One will be held Tuesday afternoons from 1 to 4 p.m. and the other on Wednesday evenings from 7 to 10 p.m. in Room J-204.

Courses for the fall semester begin Sept. 4 and run through Dec. 12. Registration for courses will be held on Sept. 2, 3 and 4 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Late registration ends at 4 p.m. on Sept. 12.

"Introduction to Film" is a three-credit course, but students may audit. The class will cover the history and appreciation of motion pictures and will be taught by Dr. Dan Greenberg, chairman of the theater department.

Information about this course and others to be offered at the Orchard Ridge campus can be obtained from the campus counseling department.

Youth Assistance also sponsors a summer camp for 30 students.

While age limits have not been set, most of the referrals are Farmington students in the junior highs. There have been students in the fifth and sixth grades and the lower levels of high school who have been referred.
