Halston's suits go Ultra-suede

As usual, the Halston collection for fall is laden with ultra-suede. But then, why not? With such a versatile fabric, especially at the hands of Halston, it alone could constitute an entire collection. Fortunately, it doesn't, and not so usual is Halston's use of soft, brushed wool, fur and jersey for a collection, recently shown at Jacobson's, containing many fresh designs as well as references to the past.

Suiting plays a heavy role in the collection, showing up as coats over dresses or simple dinner suits. The dinner suit, done in wool or

black velvet, features a simple, almost box-shape jacket over skirt or over a straight-lined sleeveless dress. It is classic in the same way that Triguere designs her line.

For day the suit is newer as Halston pairs a swirling grey-and-gold striped turtleneck dress with a grey wrapped coat, both in the softest wool, the coat done in a heavier fabric.

ULTRA SUEDE is also translated into the suit. One is a wrapped jacket paired with a skirt, another comes with pants and is luxuriously trimmed with fur.

Ultra-suede shows up again, this time for evening in floor length wrapped dresses, coats and pyjamas.

The coat is stunning, shown in baby blue, buttoned up, tailored and ready to go over anything.

Halston also uses chiffon for evening wear, doing one dress with a deep v back, draped shoulders and bat-wing sleeves. The dress ends with a handkerchief hemline. The collection is filled with classics and Halston does them well,

from the dinner jacketed dress to the flowing chiffon. Best of all, even Halston's newest designs become classics because they are styled without gimmicks but with the Halston signature.
