"LABELLING IS A FALLACY. Forget about labelling Look at a child and find out what it is he needs to help him grow. You can use the analogy of a doctor.

"You can go to a doctor who will say you're in good health. Put he won't tell you what you should do to regain good health or to mandatin it."

Reading specialists would meet a child at his present shill level and help him to improve, whether he's farshead, far behind or sinywhere in between the average reading level for his age.
