## Southfield girl aids world champs

Nancy Gornlow of Southfield had a summer she will long remember.

Miss Gornlow was a member of Real Estate One, a girls' softball team which won the U. S. Slowpitch Softball Association's Women's World Tournament.

Real Estate One defeated Enrico's of Cincinnati, 6-1, to capture the world crown recently in the tournament played in Southgate. An estimated 15,000 persons braved a rainy day to watch the finale.

Real Estate One, managed by Al Turner, topped 64 teams from across the nation which participated in the tournament. A steady rain caused continuous rescheduling of games, with many contests starting at 3 and 4 a.m. and continuing around the clock in order to determine a champion.

Real Estate One, which plays out of Redford Township, used strong defense in the tourney, allowing only eight runs in six tournament games while scoring 52 runs. Turner's girls were the only undefeated team, compiling a perfect 6-0 record.

Real Estate One's 6-1 victory over Enrico's in the tournament finale averaged a 6-1 victory by Enrico's over Real Estate One in a Kentucky contest two weeks ago.

Led by first baseman Sherry Crum's clutch hitting, Real Estate One ripped Enrico's pitchers for 20 hits in the title contest. Miss Crum went four for four in that game.

SHE HAD plenty of help from her teammates, notably Carmen King, Barb Hardison, Sue Riedel, Sue Palu, Debbie Albrecht and Marilyn Cech. All contributed two hits.

In the quarter finals, Real Estate

One bombed the Longevitys of Louisville, 10-4, and in the semifinals Turner's squad whipped Kolesar Insurance of Cincinnati, 6-2.

Real Estate One, which has compiled a 30-7 record this season, placed three players and Turner on the All-World tournament team. The players are Miss Crum, who also was selected as the tournament's most valuable player; Miss Riedel, a fine fielding shortstop; and Miss Cech, the tournament's top pitcher.

The Redford girls topped off their 1975 season by capturing their third-straight Michigan State Women's Slowpitch Softball championship in East Tawas earlier in the summer. Real Estate One defeated Charnock Olds of Dearborn, 8-3, in the title game. Miss Crum again paced the hitting attack by going four for four. Miss King added three hits.

The team started out in 1968 as a group of girls aged 17 years and under, representing the Redford Township Junior Athletic Association in an invitational tournament held in Detroit. In seven games, this team scored 104 runs and gave up just seven.

In 1976, the team entered the Redford Township Parks and Recreation Women's League and compiled the following record which eventually led them to the World Softball Championship in 1975: five times parks and recreation league champions; four times district champions of the MIPA; 1973 ASA national champion; 1974 Detroit major open championship; the 1975 Motor State Invitational crown; the East Tawas Invitational Tournament championship for three straight years (1973-75), and finally the World Softball crown.

## Falcons, Jayhawks win football games

Ken Sullivan, John Buchanan and Mike Kurylo each scored two touchdowns to lead the Southfield Jayhawks to a 48-0 victory over the Redford Raiders in a varsity Little Football League game Saturday.

Don Otten plunged one yard for an-

other Falcon touchdown. The scoring play was set up by defensive end Alan Dismore, who recovered a fumble. Late in the fourth quarter, Falcons' George Schultz gained 28 yards in five plays—and then went over left tackle for a touchdown.
