School district offers lunch price reductions

Family size and income will deter-
mine eligibility for free meals and
milk or reduced price meals at Farm-
ington's public schools.

In addition, families not meeting
the criteria but with unusually high
medical expenses, shelter costs in
excess of 30 per cent of income, spe-
cial education expenses due to a
child's mental or physical condition,
or disaster or casualty losses may
apply for the meal program.

Foster children likewise are eligible
for benefits in some cases.

Application forms, which may be
submitted at any time during the
year, are being sent to all homes, ac-
cording to Michael P. Flanagan, man-
ager of administrative and student
services. Information supplied is con-
fidential, he said, and will be used
only to determine eligibility.

Free meals and free milk will be
furnished for a family of three (one
child) where income is \$5,250 or less;
for a family of four with an income of
\$6,250; for a family of five with an in-
come of \$7,100; a family of six with
an income of \$8,110; family of seven
with an income of \$9,500; family of
eight with an income of \$10,750; family
of nine with an income of \$10,550; fam-
ily of 10 with an income of \$11,310;
family of 11 with an income of
\$12,060; and family of 12 with an in-
come of \$12,810.

Reduced price meals will be avail-

able for three member families with
an income from \$5,251 to \$7,350, four
member families with an income
from \$8,261 to \$10,770, five member
families with an income from \$7,191
to \$10,080.

Six member families with an in-
come from \$11,111 to \$11,300, seven
member families with an income
from \$12,851 to \$12,530, eight member
families with an income from \$10,791
to \$12,700, nine member families with
an income from \$10,551 to \$14,770, 10
member families with an income
from \$11,311 to \$15,840, 11 member
families with an income from \$12,061
to \$18,890, and 12 member families
with an income from \$12,811 to
\$17,940.
