

# Catholic women set workshops

All Catholic women of the Detroit archdiocese and their friends may attend a "New Worlds for Women" day Wednesday, Oct. 15, at the Michigan Inn, Southfield.

The day of workshops is sponsored by the Council of Catholic Women, a federation of parish women's organizations and inter-parish groups such as League of Catholic Women and Daughters of Isabella.

Reservation deadline for "New Worlds for Women" day is Monday.

A luncheon will honor interparish organization presidents and parish awards will be presented.

The numerous workshops will include the place of women on parish councils and commissions, the problems of the divorced and separated Catholic, natural family planning, widowhood and women's response to world hunger.

## 'Personal growth' offered

The Continuum Center for Adult Counseling and Leadership Training at Oakland University in Rochester is offering an opportunity for women to explore their struggles with each other and trained paraprofessional group leaders in a small group atmosphere.

Beginning Personal Growth for Women will be from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Mondays and Wednesdays Oct. 6-27 at Trinity Church on West Chicago in Redford Township. The first session is a free orientation to acquaint participants with the goals and objectives of the course.

Adele Weaver of Livonia and Elissa Hepner of Birmingham will coordinate the program in consultation with center staff counselor and trainer, Sylvia Walworth of Grosse Ile.

The participants will receive 1.8 continuing education units (CEU) for completing the course. CEU is a national measurement unit, one CEU per 10 classroom hours used for recording, transfer and recognition of participation in non-credit courses.

## Church celebrates world communion

"Purpose of the workshop day is to stimulate our women to action, to furnish them with knowhow, to show them that everyone can do something, no matter how small the contribution," said Mrs. Henry A. Tomaszewski of Royal Oak.

"Parish women, though a great many of them work outside the home full or parttime, find they want to give some of themselves to the parish."

"There is a vast sea of women willing to serve, but lacking the final 'push.' We hope to furnish this spark of energy through Catholic Women's Day so that the ranks of leadership may grow."

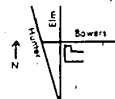
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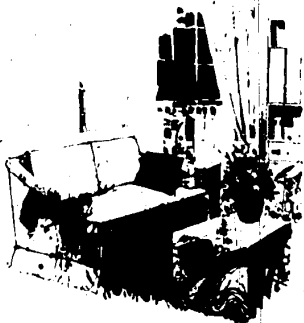
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
