The bride is employed with Kramer and Sons, Ltd. and the groom with Dictaphone Corp.



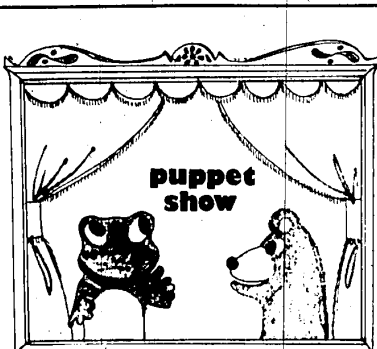
