The couple plan to be wed in May 1976.



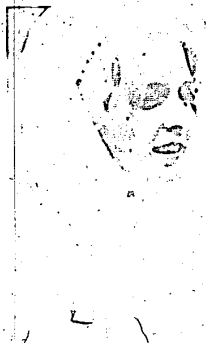
Mrs. Jerry Eagle

The couple will make their home in Wixom.

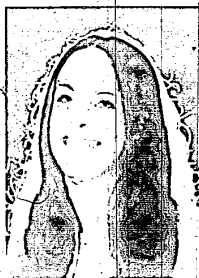


Clements-Huber
