

# Hawk golfer wins regional

Farmington Harrison's golf team joined Michigan's elite Friday when the smooth swinging Hawks became one of 21 teams qualifying for next weekend's state championships and in the bargain provided the Dunham Hills regional with its individual medalist in senior Jim Smith.

It was Smith, a senior who has been Harrison's No. 1 golfer all season, who led the Hawks to a third place team finish in the regionals by pouncing out an impressive 38-41-79 over the highly windblown par-72 Dunham Hills acreage at Milford.

Among 68 golfers representing 17 high schools, lean Jim was the only man who broke 80.

Detroit Catholic Central won the team title with a 338 score, and Wall-ed Lake Central was runner-up with a four-man total of 343. In third place, pegging down the third and last spot for qualifying to send a four-man team to the state meet, was Harrison with a team score of 347.

Farmington's other two high schools, FHS and North Farmington, also had teams in this regional, but were up the track with a 10th place finish for the Falcons and 11th place for the North foursome.

Equally instrumental with Smith in putting Harrison into the state tournament for the first time were sophomore Mike Tobin with an 85, senior Will Murphy at 88 and senior Tom Erikson who shot 95.

Next Saturday they will cap the most successful Harrison golf season yet recorded as they take the tee in

the 18-hole test over Michigan State University's Forest Akers Golf Club.

Coach Bill Spencer's team stands 11-4 in dual competition for the season, losing only to Northville and Waterford Mott—but twice to each one.

Also competing Saturday will be the 1-2-3 teams from each of six other regional plus any regional medalist whose full team fell by the wayside.

Harrison's Smith can anticipate that it will be anything but a pitch and putt fray.

## Raiders boost cross country record to 6-2

The return to action of Dave Good signaled North Farmington's return to the cross-country victory column as the Raiders took a 26-29 Northwest Suburban League decision from Redford Thurston Thursday.

After being sidelined by a back injury for 10 days, North's top runner easily demonstrated that he's over his aches and pains as he toured the rain-soaked, three-mile course in 15:52 to take individual honors.

The victory gave the Raiders a 6-2 won and lost mark for the season to date and upped their league record to 3-1. That lone loss was administered by Garden City East during Good's absence.

Not only was Good's time his best of the season, but it was only four seconds off the North Farmington school record of 15:48.

Thurston runners Craig Reynolds and Lou Macerini were second and third in clockings of 16:10 and 16:17 respectively, while the fourth place finisher was North's Dave Levy in 16:24.

Raider harriers also nailed down the sixth, seventh and eighth places, with fifth, ninth and 10th spots going to Thurston.

## Lakeland girls drub Falcons

Farmington High School's girls basketball team showed against Milford Lakeland Thursday that it still is suffering first-year growing pains as the Falcons absorbed their fourth straight loss, 45-29.

The victory kept the visiting Lakeland quietest's record in the Inter-Lakes League unblemished, with Farmington now 0-3 in the loop.

At Lakeland, where 18 points were high for the game, paced the Milford girls to an 18-4 lead in the first quarter, and by halftime they had extended the margin to 30-6.

The Falcons' only solid scoring flurry came in the fourth period when they outscored Lakeland, 16-4, after trailing at the end of the third stanza 41-12. Shelly Still led Farmington with eight points.
