U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) has introduced a bill which would prevent rail abandonments in Michigan and other states from going into effect without full congressional consideration

"There are more than a dozen major rail abandonment bills which would seek to subsidize branch lines

for periods of time from one to 10 years. I believe that some action will be taken to protect lines from immediate abandonment," Esch said.

Under present procedures, the final system plan will automatically go into effect by mid-November, "including the abandonment of more than 1.100 rules of rail line in Michigan, I believe that many of these lines are estimated to Michigan indexity and to Michigan workers," Esch said.




