

County may buy Hills office

If negotiations between the Oakland County Road Commission and developer Howard T. Keating produce a mutually agreeable purchase price, and if funding is approved, the agency plans to buy Keating's Beverly Hills office building to house its administrative offices.

The three-member road commission board voted unanimously to go ahead with the purchase after getting a report from its appraiser, and after at-

orney LeRoy McEntee told Commissioner John R. Gnuv Jr. that there is no conflict of interest involving him.

Controversy surrounded the proposed purchase after the road commission announced it had taken a 30-day option to buy the building. Gnuv is vice president of a firm that rents space in the building, and that the firm's president, Robert J. Fries of Birmingham, has a financial interest in the property.

The Keating building is on the northwest corner of the intersection of Thirteen Mile and Lahser roads in the Village of Beverly Hills.

Board of Commissioners would not be necessary.

Gnuv is vice president of American Geographics Inc., which rents space in the Keating building. Fries is president of the firm. Fries has said he is a trustee and beneficiary of two trusts totaling \$70,000, which hold mortgages on the building.

MEMBERS OF the road commission board, in addition to Gnuv, are Chairman Fred L. Harris and Commissioner William M. Richards.

If the purchase goes through, the 30,000 square foot building would be a temporary headquarters for road commission administrative offices now in the overcrowded headquarters in Pontiac and Waterford Township.

Scouts' Jambo set this weekend

The American Heritage 75 Jambo, a mini-jamboree, modeled after the National and International Scout Jamborees, will take place this weekend (Oct. 17-19). Visitors are welcome.

This is one of the biggest Scout gatherings in the Detroit Area Council history and will have many of the trappings of the national and international events: scoutcraft demonstrations, friendship games, a giant campfire program and the pageantry of American history.

Scouts from the North Trunk District—Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Berkley, Beverly Hills, Southfield, Oak Park and Franklin—will occupy one section of the Detroit Council's North Camp at Eliza Howell Park, a 250-acre area at Ferrell and Telegraph.

In keeping with the Bicentennial

theme, their camp will be designated "Ticonderoga," commemorating the May 10, 1775 capture of the famous New York fort by Ethan Allen and his Green Mountain Boys.

A major Jambo feature will be the "outpost" activities where Scout patrols of six to eight boys will compete in water boiling contests, totem carving, knot tying relay, tying trout flies, obstacle race, American flag recognition, nature identification, log sawing, first aid, tug of war and identification of figures from American history.

In addition to the 3,000 Scouts expected to participate in the North Camp, about 8,000 other Detroit-area Scouts will gather at East Camp on Belle Isle and at West Camp at Hudson Mills Park northwest of Ann Arbor.

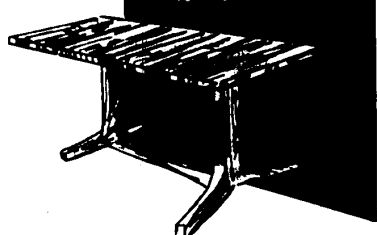

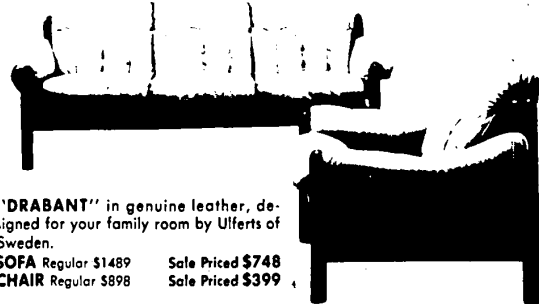
