Harold McCracken who will talk on "The Gathering Storm." David J.

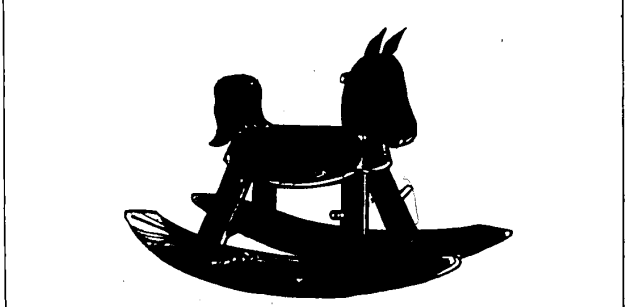

**Professor to speak to labor zionists**

The Labor Zionist Institute of Farmington Hills will be the setting for a seminar, Saturday, Nov. 1 at 8:30 p.m.

Keynote speaker will be Professor Allen Pollack, past chairman of the American Professors for Peace in the Middle East. Pollack, member of the Labor Zionist Alliance will speak on "70 Years of Labor Zionism: Prospects for the Future" at this third annual event.

Dr. Pollack is well known for his activities on behalf of Israel and Soviet Jewry. He is a member of the executive committee of the World Zionist Organization and is on the board of directors of the United Jewish Appeal. He has participated in study missions to Jordan, Egypt and Israel, the most recent, last summer.

He is currently teaching Russian history at Yeshiva University in New York City.
