CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)
A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:00 P.M. Monday, October 6, 1975 by Mayor Voder.
Present were: Councilmen Allen, Hartsock, Richardson, Yoder, Gaudinman, Tupper, was absent.
City officials present were City Manager Deadman, Directors Jones and Byrnes, Clerk Viane.
Minutes of previous meeting were approved.
Minutes of other boards were received for file.
Permission was granted to Mr. Stanley S. Rader, 2300 Hickory Ct. to install fence as requested.
The following resolutions were adopted:
Establishing a Public Hearing to review the 1975 Sidewalk Replacement Program Special Assessment Bill for November 17, 1975 at 8:00 P.M.
Authorizing financial support in the amount of \$300.00 to Communities in Opposition to Detroit, Edison Company, Rate Increase.
Encouraging youth and adults to continue efforts against vandalism preceding Halloween and particularly on Devil's Night.
Authorizing City Manager Deadman to be responsible for signing and making any changes in Community Development Programs.
Authorizing City Manager Deadman to enter into Agreement with Oakland County to act as Prime Agent for Community Development Fund for 1976 subject to provisions of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.
Awarding bid to Cadillac Asphalt Paving Company, 2753 Macom NW, Michigan in the amount of \$21,681.35 for the resurfacing of Freedom Road from the east city limits at Nine Mile Road to the west city limits at Gill Road.
Authorizing the issuance of Motor Vehicle Highway Fund Bonds and providing for a form of Notice of Sale for said bonds.
Authorizing payment to Gaglio Bros. Cement Contractors, 12099 Rebeck Road Southgate, Michigan, for the 1975 Sidewalk Replacement Program in the amount of \$15,573.11.
Establishing a Public Hearing to review the 1975 Sidewalk Replacement Program Special Assessment Bill for November 17, 1975 at 8:00 P.M.
Authorizing City Manager Deadman to prepare a tentative program for use of the 1976 Community Development Program Funds to include local road repairs, construction of parking lots on State Street in conjunction with the Farmington Community Library and Downtown Redevelopment.

(a) Right Turn shall be prohibited from the Service Drive of 2200 Grand River Avenue onto Brookdale Street.

This ordinance was introduced, adopted and enacted at a Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council on October 6, 1975 and will become effective immediately.

Hawks bid for golf title on MSU links

Northville and Waterford Mott High schools have had the whammy on Farmington Harrison's golf team all season, and if the Hawks are to shake the jinx it will have to be in the state championship meet Saturday where all three teams will be competing. The fact that these three schools from the relatively new Western Six Conference all qualified their golf varities for the state finals through three separate regional tests ranks as a notable achievement for such a young group.

Northville put its team into the state tourney at Michigan State University's Forest Acres Golf Club by winning the title in its regional last weekend at Brae Burn. Waterford Mott and Farmington Harrison both made it with third place finishes in the regionals. Mott at Grand Blanc and Harrison at Dunham Hills.

HARRISON'S HAWKS already rate as the finest golf team in the school's history, which dates back only half a dozen years, but the rub of the green still leaves something to conquer when it comes to mentioning league foes Northville and Mott.

In dual competition, Harrison is 11-4, having lost only to Northville and Mott—but twice to each school.

Then wouldn't you know it—when the Western Six held its league tournament Tuesday at the Kensington Golf Club it was Northville which finished on top with a team score of 393 strokes. Waterford Mott was second at 406, and Farmington Harrison third with 409.
