

# Falcons keep loop cross country title

Trailing in second spot, 17 seconds back at 18:00 flat, was Farmington's consistent No. 1 man, Steven Glatfelter, with Livonia Stevens' Bill Wilkins third in 18:10.

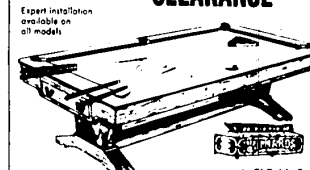
Pontiac Northern's Dave Hembree was fourth, followed by Harold Rutlia

### CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN ZONING AMENDATORY ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. C62-47

An Ordinance to amend the Zoning Ordinance No. C62 of the City of Farmington Hills, as amended.

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains:

Section 1. That the Zoning Map of said Ordinance No. C62 of the City of Farmington Hills, as amended, be amended by Ordinance No. C62-47 and the same is hereby amended to show RPA-4, Special Purpose District Classification where RA-1, One Family Residential District Classification is now shown in the area described as follows:

A parcel of land being part of the Northwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 28, Town 1 North, Range 9 East, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, being described as follows: Beginning at the West 1/2 corner of Section 28, Town 1 North, Range 9 East; thence North 89 degrees 14' 00" East, along the East and West 1/2 line of Section 28, 315.75 feet, thence continuing along the East and West 1/2 line, North 89 degrees 15' 00" East, 258.00 feet; thence South 0 degrees 02' 00" West, 196.91 feet; thence South 89 degrees 30' 00" West, 356.19 feet to a point on the West line of Section 28, thence North 0 degrees 30' 00" West, along the West line of Section 28, 856.84 feet to the point of beginning, containing 7.821 acres. Subject to easements of record and the West 60 feet thereof, for Drake Road.

Section 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a public meeting held on the 15th day of October, 1975, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.

If they compete in a sanctioned league—men or women—they will be helping the nation to celebrate its 200th birthday. More than that, they'll help to form the largest single delegation to take part in the bicentennial.

In a bulletin just released by the American Bowling Congress it was announced that the ABC and the WIBO (Women's International Congress) have joined the National Bicentennial Sports Alliance sponsored by the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration to promote active participation in the celebration.

This means that every man or woman who competes in a sanctioned league will be taking part in the big birthday party every time they bowl.

Inasmuch as the combined membership of the ABC and the WIBO totals close to eight million, no other organization can match it numerically, at least for the big year.

ONE OF THE biggest mysteries facing the metropolitan front is the slump that has gripped Cora Fiebig since the start of the season.

The top average bowler in the city a year ago and crowned "Queen" of the women bowlers, she appeared headed for a long reign.

But somewhere along the line she has lost the touch and now is far down in the list of averages with a mere 168. She has made only one spare and that came a week ago when she staged a garrison finish in the Mid-City Women's Open. She rallied to finish in the top three, but slumped back to a 345 series Wednesday night in the Ladies Major League.

WHILE CORA IS FIGHTING a slump, Mary Mohacs, a former "queen" keeps right on bowling with the leaders. This week she topped the Ladies Major with a 631 to gain a one pin edge over Lavell Brown.

WHEN IT COMES to unusual series Harry Fill's contribution in the Wonderland Classic should rate close to the top.

Last Tuesday night he opened with a 154. Unperturbed, he came right back with a 239 and closed with 309 for a 652. At that, he was 52 pins back of Tom Briceland who set the pace with a series of 705 gained on games of 279, 383 and 282.

Meanwhile, the Westland Sports team furnished the night's high with games of 1067, 962 and 1005, for 3034.

To continue: Wonderland's reputation as a high scoring house there were 185 series above 200, and 26 series at 700 or better.

However, Suburban's Jim O'Dea, Rolfe Biller, Bud Stefanko and Elmer Rousseaux all tallied in the second against Spartan goals by Jack Porter and Mike Foster. Another by Chuck Drake cut it to 4-3, which is how it ended, although the play got wild and woolly going down to the wire.
