Longacre School sponsors a beautification planting

Longacre Elementary School is sponsoring its third annual "Beauty Your Neighborhood School Day" on Saturday, Oct. 25. If the weather is bad, the tree plantings will be delayed one week to Saturday, Nov. 1.

The program is for parents of Longacre students who wish to beautify the school by contributing trees to be planted on the school site.

The school is cooperating with Steinkopf Nursery, which is offering guaranteed trees at a discount to Longacre families a family can't plant itself.

THE SCHOOL ALSO needs peat and topsoil, both of which can be purchased from local nurseries.

Trees offered include a "Living Memorial" blue spruce for \$25. Sugar maples and Norway maples are offered for \$15, and a flowering crab with pink or red flowers for \$12.50.

Selling for \$10 apiece are Norway spruce, Marshall seedling ash, purple leaf plum, locust and mountain ash. American arbutus sells for \$8.50, viburnum for \$3 and huneysuckle and forsythia also for \$3. A small yellow viciary sells for \$2.

According to Sprague, the school has the greatest need of Norway spruce, flowering crab, purple leaf plum, viburnum and arbutus.

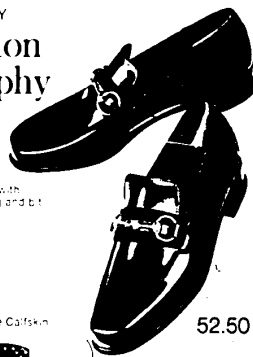
MICHAEL R. MUNROCK, JR.
