### Why kids should be enjoyed by adults

One way to make the most of your children's childhood is to simply relax and enjoy them at every age. Dr. Glenn Chalfee told parents at the open house Friday night at the Early Learning Center of Farmington Parents often see their children midsances, he said, but "Childhood isn't something you put up with on the way to being an adult." Rather, 'nit's during these early years that children decide what kind of world it is' and whether they are worthwhile and loved.

Chaffee advised "doing away with
the adversary relationship between
parents and children, which really
shows up in the teen years." He said,
"If we knew how to be parents comfortably, we would move into that
time comfortably."
Children need to be taught how to
express their emotions effectively
Chaffee thinks it is damaging for parents to quietly intellectualize their
anger when they are really angry, because it does not effectively convey
their emotion. Punishing out out of
anger as long as the parent is in control of himself is sometimes better
than cool, judicious discipline where
the child cannot feel the parent's emotions.

"We want to feel really good about

"We want to feel really good about our children no matter what age they are and enjoy them as people." Chaffee said "Children need to see their parents being affectionate," and need to hear their parents tell them. "I löve you."
