

## Musicale salutes federation Nov. 5

The Farmington Musicales will hold its Federation Day meeting with a musical program Wednesday, Nov. 5, at 12:30 a.m. in Farmington Community Library on Twelve Mile Road.

The annual Federation Day is a salute from the local clubs to the parent organization, the National Federation of Music Clubs.

Guest speaker for the local celebration is Mrs. Richard Shannon, immediate past president of the Michigan Federation of Music Clubs.

More than 1,000 music clubs in the United States are affiliated with the

parent organization. Including the Farmington Musicales, there are 49 senior active clubs, five senior associate clubs and 112 junior and student clubs in Michigan.

These clubs, totaling more than 600,000 members nationally, have set aside November as the month to acknowledge and learn more about the National Federation of Music Clubs. The federation promotes an interest in music throughout the country by music-oriented activities at national, state and local level.

THE MUSIC PROGRAM in Farmington will include selections by soprano

and Joyce Bigelow, of Livonia, and oboist Sandra Williams, of Farmington Hills. They will be accompanied by Sue McCallum, of Farmington.

Three woodwind ensembles from the musicale's junior club, the Glockenspiel, will be directed by Fern Barber. A quartet of seventh graders will perform a chorale; a double duet of eighth graders playing flutes and clarinets will offer two Bach works; and a clarinet quintet of high school students will play a modern work for a change of pace.

Mrs. Barber, a resident of North-

ville and known in Farmington as an instrumental music teacher in the elementary schools, is co-advisor with Frances Gambino of the Glockenspiel. Mrs. Gambino lives in Farmington Hills.

The program will be moderated by Neida Dibiasi, of Livonia. Reservations will be taken by Mrs. Charles Osterdale, 3050 Springland, Farmington Hills. There is a small guest fee asked for the tea following the program. Baby-sitting is also available at a charge.

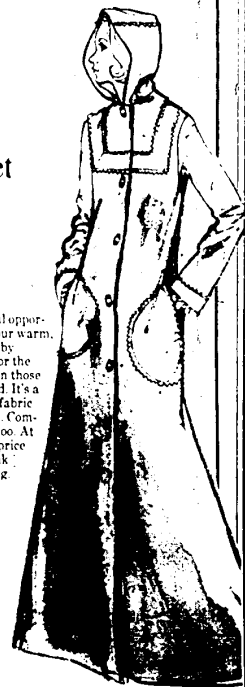
