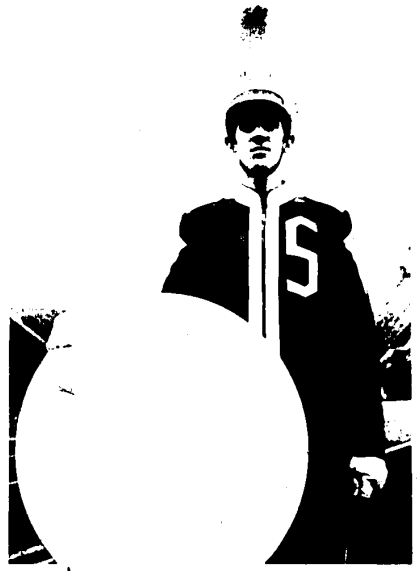
**KINGLSEY J. GRANT**
