

Raider girls down Franklin

Birmingham Groves girls swim team did what it usually does at this time of year and dominated the Metro Suburban Association league meet last Thursday at Bloomfield Hills Lahser.

Groves took firsts in four of the 11 events and compiled 300 points, 185 more than runner up Lahser, which also won four events. Southfield-Lathrup was third with 182 points. Rochester Adams had 100, Royal Oak Dendro 111 and Ulster Eisenhower 62.

Lathrup's Laura Croshaw won the 100-yard butterfly in 1:04.43, and finished second in the 200-yard individual freestyle in 2:24.95. Another Charger, Lisa Akerman, finished second in the 100-yard backstroke (1:05.32) and took fourth in the 200-

yard freestyle (2:07.46). Lathrup coach Lynn Marshall got more points from Cindy MacMillan, who took a third in the 500-yard freestyle with a 6:06.94 clocking.

"In general, the times in the prelims were very slow," said Marshall, whose team is 6-3 overall and 3-2 in MSA dual meets. "In the finals the times were a bit better. On our team, the times were good all around."

Dondoro's Mary Quarles was a double winner, taking the 100-yard freestyle (56.93) and the 200 freestyle (2:03.66). Lahser's Lynn Lagerkvist also won two events: the 100 backstroke (1:03.84) and the 200 IM (2:30.34).

Groves' winners: Linda Mrosko, 26.68 in the 50 freestyle; Kathy Hag-

erson, 5:44.32 in the 500 freestyle; Ann Staufacher, 1:14.99 in the 100 breaststroke; and the 400-yard freestyle relay. Depth was an important factor in Groves' victory.

North Farmington-Franklin North Farmington won 10 of 11 events in defeating Livonia Franklin, 117-55, last Thursday in a Northwest Suburban League dual meet.

North's Patty Gasser won the 200-yard freestyle in 2:15.0 and the 100-yard freestyle in 1:01.7. Teammate Cathy Burk won the 200-yard individual medley in 2:37.0. Margaret Rodewig finished second in diving with 134 points.

"We weren't pressured for this meet, that's for sure," said North Farmington coach Pat Duthie. "We swam people out of their regular events, so we didn't have that many outstanding times. It's kind of hard to get up and swim well when you know you really don't have to."

North Farmington, now 6-2 overall, swims next in the NSL meet at Thurston High on Thursday (Nov. 4). Host Thurston doesn't have a girls' swimming team, nor does Garden City East. The league meet will consist of North, Franklin and Westland John Glenn.

W.L. Western-Harrison Walled Lake Western stopped Farmington Harrison, 106-47, in a Western Six League dual meet last Thursday.

Harrison's Linda Lahey was a double winner, taking the 200-yard freestyle and the 100-yard freestyle. The Hawks' Karen Rudel also won two events, the 200 individual medley and the 100 backstroke. The loss dropped Harrison to 3-11 overall.

Harrison will host the Western Six League Meet on Thursday. On Friday (Nov. 7), the Harrison girls swimmers will hold a swim-a-thon with the proceeds going to the American Cancer Society.

Falcons, Redford top 3-school race

Farmington High reigns as cross country city champion, but Farmington Harrison's Mike Redford is the individual champ.

That was the story after the three Farmington high schools finished their annual tri meet last week at the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College. Farmington High compiled 26 team points to finish first. Harrison was second with 46 points, and North Farmington followed with 54.

Redford, a senior, was first across the line in 15:13.5—a record for the OCC course, which is used as home base by Farmington and Harrison. "He's for real, that's for sure," said Harrison coach Larry Fortner. "Redford is a real tough runner. And that's a pretty tough course to get a record on."

second in 15:26, and teammate Harold Rutla was third in 15:31.
