The rules of duplicate bridge have always included a requirement that one's opponents must be fully enlightened about bidding conventions.

The modern policy for tournament play is that all unusual calls, calls that might be misunderstood, be brought to the attention of the opposition when they are made.

West led the seven of diamonds. In the bidding shown with the hand in the diagram, the importance becomes apparent. West's two club overcalls could be either a strong or a weak bid.

As examination of the hands show, it is a weak take-out for the unbid suits. When South bids, he promises little strength and it becomes quite important that North be able to evaluate West's call.

Actually South is not too strong, but assurance that West does not have a huge hand is enough to allow North to encourage South to take aggressive action.

Despite the balance of high cards nothing can defeat the slam, but East and West should have been able to use the same information to sacrifice in hearts.
