Rabbi Schwartz has been a rabbi with Temple Beth El since July 1974, and is an honor graduate of Hofstra University and Hebrew Union College.

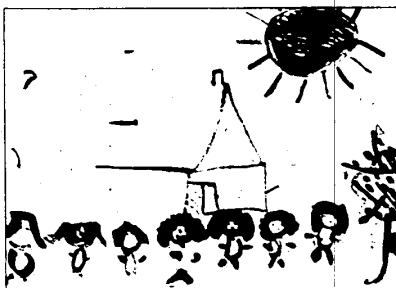

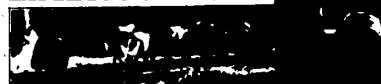


A card for AASK
