Bicentennial calendar features local artists

Detroit's bicentennial calendar, which features the work of 11 area artists is now on sale in shops throughout the metropolitan area.

The all-color calendar, which promotes Detroit in the bicentennial year, is the result of a contest sponsored by the Junior League of Detroit which was open to all art students currently attending college.

Oakland County students ran away with all prizes while three of the top spots were captured by Farmington women.

Pat Adams, a student from Oakland Community College, took the first place award, and her illustration is featured on the cover of the calendar.

Lisa Marsh, of Henry Ford Community College, and Kathy Kurth of OGC Orchard Ridge Campus took second and third places.

Winners from Southfield whose works are in the calendar are John Moga, Chris Gunkle and Kay Hubbs.

Winners from Birmingham are Kenneth Schetting, Todd MacIntosh and Jane Schmidt.

Also on the winners list from the 110 entries are Mary Melissa O'Rear of Novi, and Kathleen Smolinski of Union Lake.

Format for the calendar was designed by Ford and Earl Design Associates under the heading "Rediscover Detroit."

The art ranges from a pen and ink panorama of Detroit's history, to an oil painting of the Renaissance Center in its early stages. The 14 illustrations are accompanied with a narrative giving facts about Detroit's past and present.

The calendar is an official Detroit bicentennial project and sells for \$3.50.
