The Michigan Inter-Professional Association on Marriage, Divorce and the Family is sponsoring a program entitled *Troubled Youth* Thursday, Nov. 20, from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. in Northland Land Inn in the Southfield Rooms.

The content of the program will examine the social, psychological and physiological components of involvement with society and the problems encountered by young people 16 to 21. It will focus on how related disciplines can work together to assist youth in resolving their various antisocial behavior.

The subject will include, but will not be limited to, a consideration of youth involvement with alcohol, drugs and promiscuity. Understanding our youth is perhaps our biggest problem and greatest challenge. This program will help to evaluate where we stand in relation to youth.

The speaker will be Derek Miller, M.D., associate chairman of the department of psychiatry at the University of Michigan Medical Center and Director of the Adolescents Center at the University.
