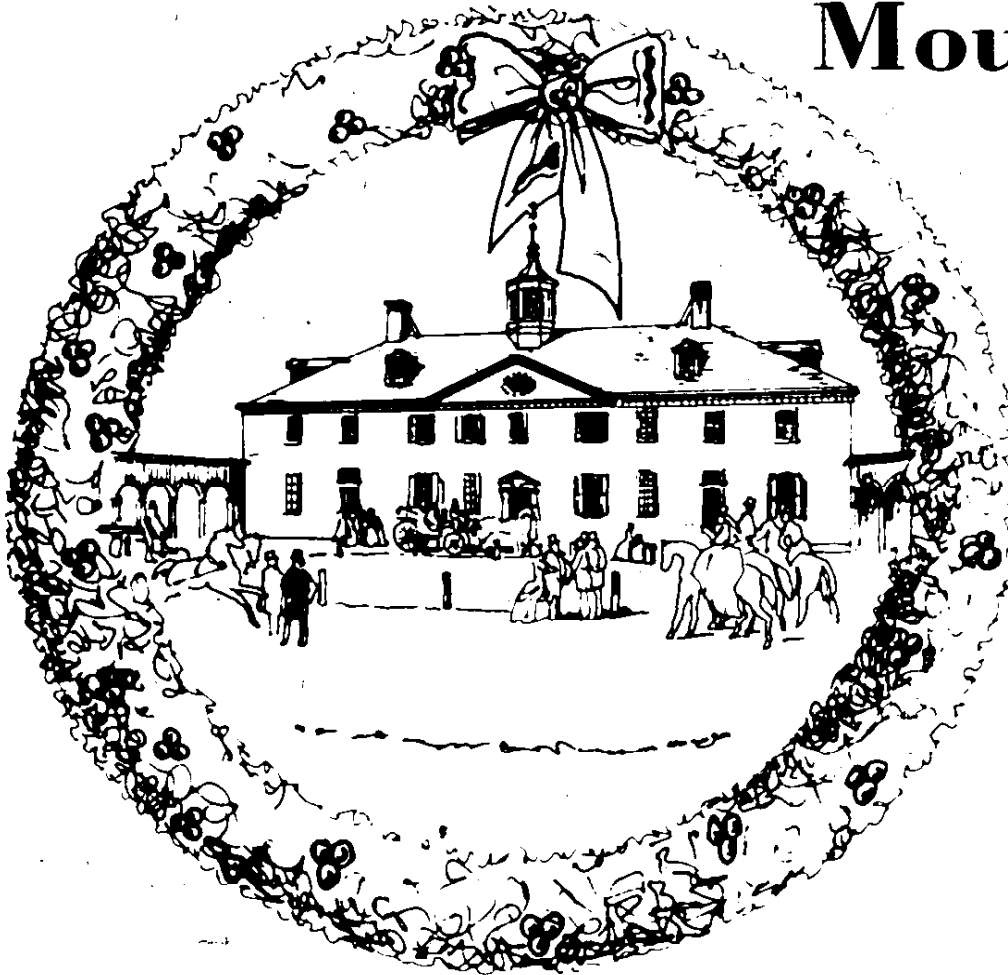


# Mount Vernon special



Even though Martha and George Washington were not known for their holiday culinary feasts at elegant Mount Vernon, they did eat. Thomas Jefferson is credited with being the first gourmet president.

Commemorating America's Bicentennial, 22 member organizations of the Women's National Farm and Garden Association of Oakland County have gathered together favorite recipes of their own and assigned them names of famous Americans or American locations.

These recipes are included in the garden club's "Bicentennial" Great Canapes book which will benefit an Outdoor Reading Garden construction at the Bloomfield Township Public Library.

Here's Martha's Washington Bread Sticks:

- 1 loaf thin sliced bread (not extra thin)
- 1/2 lb whipped margarine
- 1 tablespoon toasted sesame seeds
- 1/2 tablespoon chopped fresh chive
- 1/2 tablespoon dry parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon tarragon

Place herbs in chopping bowl and chop. Add to whipped margarine and mix well. Spread on slices of bread. Cut off crusts and cut into finger-sized slices. Sprinkle lightly with the sesame seeds. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 300°F for about 20 minutes. Cool and store in a tin.
