

Adat Shalom honors Gov. Bill Milliken

Gov. William G. Milliken recently was presented the highest award Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin can confer on a non-Israeli during a Michigan-Israel Dinner of State at Adat Shalom Synagogue in Farmington Hills.

The Israeli Prime Minister's Medal was presented to the governor by Moshe Kol, Israel's Minister of Tourism and a founding father of the nation.

Rabin said Milliken was chosen for this high honor "in appreciative recognition of the exemplary role which he and the good people of Michigan have played in the unfolding drama of Israel's reborn."

"As a champion of the cause of Israel, Gov. Milliken and people of good will throughout the state have served in the finest tradition of our country and our state in fostering the values which all America holds dear."

EARLIER IN THE DAY, Milliken also received a badge from the National Zionist Movement from State Sen. Daniel S. Cooper, Lucas Parish of Southfield, national vice president of the Zionist Organization of America, Vern Leopold of the Zionist Federation of Detroit, House Majority Floor Leader Joseph Forbes of Oak Park, and Sen. Jack Faxon of Detroit.

Milliken said, "We friends of Israel must do all we can to help that nation resist any new attacks upon its legitimacy as a secular state." He also called the recent United Nations General Assembly resolution against Zionism "deplorable."

After receiving the medal, Milliken said, "The establishment of the State of Israel was to the modern age what the founding of this nation was to an earlier century—a miracle wrought of divine guidance and human struggle, a great victory for the oppressed, a bold affirmation, before all the world, of the inherent dignity and worth of the individual."

AT THE DINNER, held during the 25th anniversary year of the Israel Bonds campaign, Milliken said he was honored to receive the award from one of the founding fathers of Israel. "It is a great personal pleasure for me, and a great tribute to the common bonds of brotherhood and democracy that unite the people of this country with the people of Israel."

Milliken also said that ever since David Ben-Gurion proclaimed Israeli statehood on May 14, 1948, the continued survival of the new nation has required heroic bravery and sacrifices from its people and vigorous support of its friends.

The governor said in addition to the military dangers of the Middle East situation, Israel now faces yet another problem—the U.N. resolution condemning Zionism.

"There is the very real danger that this deplorable resolution might be the first step in a new effort to challenge what Israel's U.N. Ambassador Chaim Herzog describes as a 'unique and unbroken connection, extending some 4,000 years, between the People of the Book and the Land of the Bible.'"

For both the U.S. and Israel to withdraw from the U.N. would be to abandon the field to those whose ideals both countries jointly oppose, said Milliken.

He thinks that both countries must remain in the international arena of the U.N. and continue to speak out against true racism, racial discrimination, oppression and threats to peace and security.

"It is important, too, that those nations who voted in favor of this resolution realize that in supporting the sovereignty of the secular State of Israel, we are supporting the sovereignty of their states as well. A threat to one is a threat to all," he concluded.

Ski classes sponsored
